

Trails at Bowdoin Park

The trail system at Bowdoin Park is comprised of about 5 miles of marked trails. These trails wander through the quieter parts of the park including fields and forests and are open to walkers, hikers, runners, and leashed dogs. The trail surface is mostly natural and can be rocky at places. Please be careful while using the trails and it is always a good idea to go with at least one other person.

Wildlife is abundant in the park, keep a look out for deer, turkeys, woodchucks, Pileated Woodpeckers, and many more! Ticks and Poison Ivy are also present, so be aware of where you walk and always check for ticks after exiting the trails.

The staff at Bowdoin Park work to keep the trails suitable for use, but storms and other natural events sometimes leave the trails with obstacles and challenges that you will encounter before we do, please report any problems with the trails to the main office.

Please check park closing time before starting on a trail. Allow sufficient time to exit the park before it closes.

Distances and trail locations on the map are approximations.

Bowdoin Park Rules

- Park opens at 9 AM.
Closing time changes seasonally.
- Dogs must be leashed.
- Clean up after your pet.
- Do not LITTER.
- Do not remove or disturb natural or cultural resources.
- No fires except in grills.
- No alcohol without a permit.
- No bikes on trails.
- Horseback riding is prohibited
