Farmers Landing

A private residence situated directly across from the Hudson River in the Wheeler Hill Historic District is where the prosperous Verplanck family and other farmers would bring their crops to be shipped out to other cities.

Carnwath Farms Historic Site & Park This 99.7 acre estate overlooking the majestic Hudson River is home to an 1850 Italianate Style mansion, 1873 Carriage House, 1870 Ice House, Resse Cultural Center (Home to the Sports Museum of Dutchess County), chapel, and the future home of the town of Wappinger Museum & Visitor Center. www.carnwathfarms.webs.com



Chelsea School House

Constructed in 1875, this school was the first school in the newly formed Town of Wappinger. By 1939, all hamlet or individual district schools were closed and condensed in to one centralized school. It is now owned by the Chelsea Fire Department as a headquarters and also the home of the Chelsea Post Office.

St. Mark's Episcopal Church

The church was founded in 1865 by John A. Taplin and thirteen other residents of Carthage Landing (Chelsea). In June, 1869, Rt. Rev. Horatio Potter, Bishop of New York, dedicated the new church. www.stmarkschelsea.dioceseny.org

<u>"Driftwood"</u>


Constructed in 1899, this private residence was home of the founder of the Chelsea Yacht Club, and riverboat captain, Moses Collyer. This house is an excellent example of the style of architecture along the Hudson at that time. The corner stone is marked "M.W. Collyer/1899"

Castle Point Park

Neighboring the United States Castle Point Veterans Hospital, the park was donated by the federal government to the people of the Town of Wappinger. Castle Point Park is the home of two ball fields, playground, pavilion, and a monument dedicated to a young Chelsea resident who died in the Korean War.

Chelsea Yacht Club & Waterfront

This waterfront contributed to the growth of the hamlet of Chelsea, at one time being the largest port in the Hudson River Valley. The yacht club was started in 1881 as an ice yacht club. A boat ramp is available to the public by the Town of Wappinger. www.chelseayacht.org
