

Safe **Riding and Walking Suggestions**

- vehicular traffic regulations. All bicyclists and pedestrians should be aware that they are riding and walking on public roads and are subject to all
- Bicyclists travel with traffic, on the right side of the road, or on the right road shoulder where available.
- Pedestrians should use sidewalks when they are available, or
- walk along the left side of the road, facing traffic. All children under age 14 must wear a helmet for bicycling;
- a helmet is recommended for all bicyclists and in-line skaters, regardless of age.
- . Wear bright-colored clothing and display reflectors and lights after dark.

Bike and Walk Tour

Loop A

Mile Rhinebeck to Rhinecliff

- 0.0 E. Market St. (Route 308) public parking area, across from the firehouse near Center Street.
- 0.1 Left (east) on E. Market St. for 2 blocks and right (south) on Mulberry St. for 1 block then left on South St. for 1 block. Turn right on Parsonage St.
 0.2 Base Lione Back
- 0.2 Pass Lions Park.
- 0.7 Travel a half mile south on Parsonage St. turn right (west) on Mill St.
- 0.8 West on Mill St. John Benner Stone House, 1740, is on right, near Rte. 9.
- 0.9 Cross Rte. 9, Mill Rd. is ahead and passes through Rhinebeck Cemetery, founded in 1832.
- 1.6 Cross bridge over Landsman Kill near Mill Pond.
- 3.2 Turn right (west) on Morton Rd. (Rte. 85) to continue bike route. To get to Landsman Kill and Vanderburg Cove, leave bike route, continue on South Mill Rd. 1.5 miles.
- 3.3 Wilderstein, 1888, is on the left.
- 5.5 Hamlet of Rhinecliff: Morton Rd. curves north and becomes local streets and Route 308. For a ride overlooking the Hudson: left at triangle on Butler St. 2 blocks, right on Grinnell St. for 4 blocks, right on Schatzell St. 1 block. Left on Charles St. passing Amtrak station and bridge to Rhinebeck Town Landing Riverfront Park (fishing/ boating access). Charles St. turns into Rhinecliff Rd. Continue along this route.
- 6.2 Sign at side of Rhinecliff Rd. for Long Dock historic area.
- 6.6 Left turn (north) on Ryan Rd.
- 7.4 Left turn (north) on River Rd. (Rte. 103), continue until first right turn.
- 7.8 Right turn on Astor Dr.
- 9.1 Right turn on Montgomery St., for 1 block (or left turn for Bike Route Loop B).
- 9.2 Cross Rte. 9, left (north) on Rte. 9.
- 9.7 Rte. 9 north for 1/2 mile up to next right, just before the Dutchess County Fairgrounds.
- 9.8 One block east near Dutchess County Fairgrounds gate, right (south) on Mulberry St., past fairground grandstand.
- 10.4 Follow Mulberry St. (south) through residential area to Market St. Right on E. Market St. 1.5 miles to public parking.

Loop B

Mile Northern Rhinebeck

- 0.0 Connect to Loop A at Montgomery Street via Astor Dr. (1 block from Rte. 9).
- 0.6 Take Montgomery St. to the north, take right fork at intersection.
- 2.2 Old Post Rd. north to Hook Rd., turn left (northwest). (To get to Old Rhinebeck Aerodrome, continue along Old Post Rd., cross 9G, continue to Rte. 9. Left half a mile, then right (east) on Stone Church Rd. 2.5 mile one-way trip.)
- 2.7 Hook Rd. until first right, at Middle Rd., turn right (north). Cross Rte. 9G, continue on Middle Rd. to "T" intersection.
- 4.2 Left turn on Rokeby Rd. (west) at next fork, at 4.8 miles, bear left. (To go to the Village of Red Hook, take right at fork and follow Benner Rd. north one mile then right at Garden or Fraleigh St.; restaurants, services, shopping. One-way trip 1.5 miles.)
- 5.9 Continue west on Rokeby Rd. at River Rd. turn left (south) on River Rd. (Rte. 103). See Rokeby historic sign and gatehouse (private property). (To get to Montgomery Place, 1805, Bard College, or Tivoli Bays Wildlife Management Area, go right (north) on River Rd. One way trips of 1 and 2 miles.)
- 6.2 Poets Walk, 120-acre rustic park, walking paths to Hudson views, parking, free entry. Continue south on River Rd. (Rte. 103), pass Atalanta estate on the right, cross Rte. 199, then continue a short distance on River Rd. to the next left.
- 7.0 Turn left on Upper Hook Rd. (southeast).
- 7.4 Continue on Hook Rd.
- 8.7 Right (south) on Old Post Rd. to intersection with Mt. Rutsen Rd.
- 10.2 Continue south on Montgomery St. Continue on Montgomery St. to intersect with Bike Loop A.
