TASTE

Pick from all-day breakfast options and classic burgers at **Eveready Diner** (Hyde Park) — featured on Food Network's "Diners, Drive-ins and Dives" — for a taste of retro Americana. Nestled in a quiet part of Staatsburg, visit River and Post for hearty dishes with seasonal flair alongside a bevy of creative cocktails and non-alcoholic beverages. For hearty plates of American classics, Foster's Coach House Tavern (Rhinebeck) has been in operation since 1890. Or find simple, fresh comfort food in the form of tasty







tacos and burritos at Bubby's Take Away Kitchen (Red Hook).

Modern Irish at Bia, Thai curries at **Aroi** and Neapolitan-style pizzas made in a wood-burning, brick oven at Market St. are hints of international influence on the food scene in the Village of Rhinebeck, Housed in a former-church-turned-restaurant. Terrapin Restaurant, Bistro & Bar has celebrated farm-to-table for more than 25 years. Make a note to check out {pretty to think so}'s raw bar, caviar service and cocktails. Bread Alone Bakery stands out not only for its pastries and freshly baked goods, but also for their sustainable practices.

Visit **Taconic Distillery** (Stanfordville) to taste small-batch bourbon and rye whiskies. Hudson Valley Vineyards, formerly Clinton Vineyards (Clinton Corners), and Milea Estate Vineyard (Staatsburg) offer picturesque views and award-winning wines.

BRING HOME

Hunt for collectibles at Red Hook's Hudson Valley Vintage, Hoffman's Barn, Megabrain Comics, and the Annex Antiques Center or Staatsburg's Rhinebeck Antique **Emporium. Hyde Park Antiques**

Center, a 9,500-square-foot shop featuring multiple vendors, was once the headquarters for FDR's Secret Service contingent.

The quaint-but-bustling Village of Rhinebeck's blocks are lined with historic buildings housing a variety of shops. Find stylish gifts at Paper Trail, timeless fashion and accessories at the Rhinebeck Mercantile and eclectic finds from around the globe at Winter Sun & Summer Moon. Hummingbird Jewelers specializes in antique restoration and custom one-of-a-kind creations. Collectors will find a plethora of sought-after records at Rhinebeck Vinyl Vault. Samuel's Sweet Shop offers old-fashioned candies. Catch co-owners Paul Rudd, Jeffrey Dean Morgan and Hilarie Burton! Shop for culinary tools like a top chef at Warren Kitchen & Cutlery.





NOT TO BE MISSED

A wonderful way to get a view of the city, along with sweeping vistas of the Hudson River and the Catskill Mountains, is to visit the Walkway Over the Hudson State Historic Park (Poughkeepsie). Rising 212 feet above the ground and stretching 1.28 miles across, it's the world's longest elevated pedestrian bridge. Take a glass-walled elevator down to Upper Landing Park. A short walk leads you to Victor C. Waryas Park on the Poughkeepsie waterfront, where you can spot cruise ships, sailboats and crew shells. Shop the seasonal Poughkeepsie Waterfront Market at the Mid-**Hudson Discovery Museum Pavilion.**

Visit the collaborative art space with rotating exhibits at **Gallery 40**, followed by drinks and bites at **1915**



Wine Cellar or Mercat 1915. Many galleries, such as Womenswork.Art, offer unique points of view. Visit The Trolley Barn for national juried art shows curated and presented by young artists enrolled in The Art Effect program. The nonprofit Arts Mid-Hudson sponsors area events and oversees permanent galleries and a pop-up shop.

The **Cunneen-Hackett Arts Center's** Victorian, Hancock and
Reception galleries, housed in two
Victorian-age buildings, showcase
works by local and regional artists and
performances in their 200-seat theater.

Taking off from **Sky Acres Airport** in LaGrangeville, let **Hudson Valley Flight Service** take you on an aerial tour of the Hudson Valley in a Cessna 182.

It was born out of a need for owners Izzy and Raquel Roman to find restaurants to eat with their sons, two of whom have severe food allergies. In Poughkeepsie, head to Cocina La Cabañita de Oaxaca for authentic Mexican cuisine: Tamarind for flavorful curries; and La Deliziosa Italian Pastry Shop for mouthwatering desserts. To the east, you'll find a classic diner at the Daily Planet, traditional Greek dishes at **Athena Gyro** (LaGrangeville) and churrascostyle dishes at **Hudson Valley** Portuguese Churrasqueira (Verbank).



Craft beverage lovers will want to check out the City of Poughkeepsie for Blue Collar Brewery, King's Court Brewing Company and Zeus Brewing Company, which has the city's only rooftop bar with views of the Hudson River. Shadows on the Hudson received Wine Spectator's Best of Award of Excellence in 2023.



Anchoring Beacon's reputation as a thriving center of the arts is Dia Beacon, one of the world's leading contemporary art museums. Main Street also has several art galleries, like the Marion Royael Gallery, the BAU Gallery and the Clutter Gallery.

Spend the day discovering a whole roster of pick-your-own vegetables, fruits and flowers at Barton Orchards (Poughquag). Kids will love the petting zoo, corn maze and mini-golf course while the adults enjoy a craft brew or hard cider from The Tap Room. Even your four-legged family members can romp in the Bark Park. Festivals take place every weekend from August-

November, but their farm store is open year-round.

Make sure there's room in the car for treasures found at Stormville Airport's Antique Show and Flea Market. An outdoor shopping experience for the whole family, this weekend-long event draws more than 600 vendors offering apparel and accessories, housewares, furniture and art. It takes place monthly from April through November.

Sloop Brewing Co. (East Fishkill) produces Juice Bomb, a bright, hazy, juicy New England IPA that's garnered national popularity out of its East Fishkill factory. Single-hop explorations — like Mosaic and Simcoe — tweak the recipe into different "Bombs."

Industrial Arts Brewing Company (Beacon) builds on their excellent Wrench IPA line with a delicious nonalcoholic version, Safety Glasses IPA, from a taproom overlooking the Hudson Highlands.

Using ingredients from their farm and hopyard, **Obercreek Brewing Company** (Wappingers Falls) celebrates American hop varietals.

Currant Trends

C.Cassis (Rhinebeck) is an all-natural liqueur made by hand from Dutchess County black currants; it's excellent on its own or in a cocktail, bringing notes of lemon verbena and honey.

Slate Point Meadery (Poughkeepsie) pairs bold black currants with clover blossom honey and rosemary in a marvelous mead.

Branchwater Farms (Milan) distills a bold brandy from black currants gown by Dutchess farmer Greg Quinn, who helped repeal the century-old ban on currants in New York in 2003.

Pretty and Funky

Hudson Valley Brewery (Beacon), known for their Instagram-worthy colorful Sour IPAs, also makes fruity, bottle-conditioned wines.

Home-grown hot peppers or fresh cucumbers and dill are a few of the unexpected ingredients appearing in **Plan Bee Farm Brewery** (Poughkeepsie) sours and farmhouse saisons, fermented with native yeast from honey cultivated on-site.

Low-intervention fruited wines and ciders are the focus at Rose Hill Ferments (Red Hook). Pearly Dewdrops invokes plum jerkum, while Prologue uses the Solera system of aging, blending past vintages together each year.

Traditional Takes and Old-World Wonders

Milea Estate Vineyard (Staatsburg), offers varietals found only here through its Hudson Valley Heritage Wines project. They produce wines from grape varietals originally bred locally as early as the 1800s.



C.Cassis, Rhinebeck

Tenmile Distillery (Wassaic) is dedicated to crafting whiskey in the traditional Scottish style, resulting in an impeccably smooth sip.

Junmai Daiginjo-only sake at **Dassai Blue** (Hyde Park) is the highest level of premium sake and the first of its kind made in the U.S., using the gold standard of rice.

Millbrook Vineyards & Winery is the only producer of vinifera Tocai Friulano in the Hudson Valley.

Daring Distillers

Vale Fox Distillery's (Poughkeepsie) "from the cocktail backward" approach to spirits is a perfect match for Jeffrey Dean Morgan and Hilarie Burton's project MF Libations.

Maid of the Meadow from **Denning's Point Distillery** (Beacon) makes an impression with flavors of honey, wild herbs and raspberry.

Shady Knoll Orchard and Distillery's (Millbrook) take on pommeau, a French apple brandy, pairs beautifully with sparkling wine in a mix they dub "Pommeau Royale."

Trevor Zoo (Millbrook)
From red pandas to lemurs and wallabies to bobcats, you'll find more than 170 exotic and indigenous animals representing 70 different species from five different continents — including 11 endangered species — at this AZA-accredited zoo. Established in 1936 at the Millbrook School, it's the only zoo in America located on a high school campus, and students care for the animals as part of a one-of-a-kind educational experience. The zoo is open every day (except for a few holidays).

SplashDown Beach (Fishkill)
"America's Biggest Little Water Park" features outdoor water slides and attractions suitable for kids of all ages.
Nearly six stories tall and more than 600 feet long, the Arctic Mammoth is one of the biggest raft rides in the Northeast.
Little ones love the Shipwreck Lagoon, an area filled with interactive fountains, geysers and dumping buckets.
Get your pulse racing on The Megalodon raft ride or the Humunga Half-Pipe (New York's only zero-gravity half-pipe).
Or cool off and relax as you float down the Croc Creek Wavy Lazy River in your own tube. Open Memorial Day to Labor Day.

Mid-Hudson Discovery Museum (Poughkeepsie)

Located on the picturesque Poughkeepsie Waterfront, the Mid-Hudson Discovery Museum will ignite and inspire the next generation of critical thinkers, problem solvers and innovators. History's Tapestry

Step back into Dutchess County's fascinating past and discover the stories of the people whose hands, work, inspirations and innovations defined our history and built our community.

HISTORY TIMELINE

Indigenous/Colonial/Revolutionary War

Clermont State Historic Site (Germantown)

Home to seven generations of the prominent Livingston family. Chancellor Robert R. Livingston helped draft the Declaration of Independence and the New York State Constitution. He later negotiated the Louisiana Purchase and helped develop the first steamboat. Tours and events include stories about all who lived and worked on the estate, including enslaved peoples, and access to trails and gardens.

Mount Gulian Historic Site (Beacon)

The Verplanck family homestead, built around 1730. Roughly 8,000 years of history are documented there, dating back to the indigenous people who inhabited the land. The site served as Revolutionary War headquarters of Major General Friedrich Von Steuben, whose European training methods were vital to George Washington's inexperienced soldiers. Von Steuben helped form America's first fraternal veterans' organization, the Society of the Cincinnati, in 1783. Read excerpts of the journal kept by James F. Brown, who was born into slavery in Maryland, escaped to freedom and worked as a free man for the Verplancks as Mount Gulian's head gardener and property manager. Guided tours seasonally.

19th Century

Locust Grove Estate (Poughkeepsie)

This Italianate-style mansion was once the summer retreat of telegraph and code inventor Samuel F. B. Morse. See over 15,000 pieces of fine and decorative arts, paintings and furniture collected by the Young family, the last estate owners. The mansion, gardens and trails on the 200-acre property are open seasonally.

Wilderstein Historic Site (Rhinebeck)

Queen Anne-style Victorian house on the Hudson was the home of FDR's cousin and confidant Margaret "Daisy" Suckley. The 40-acre property, designed by landscape architect Calvert Vaux, includes a network of carriage drives and trails. Guided tours held seasonally; grounds open year-round.

Gilded Age

Staatsburgh State Historic Site (Staatsburg)

The lavish country home of Ogden and Ruth Livingston Mills, this 79-room Beaux-Arts mansion was once a social hub for America's elite. Special themed tours include "Tales of the Titanic" and "Gilded Age Scandals." This 192-acre property features hiking and biking trails.

Vanderbilt Mansion National Historic Site (Hyde Park) This 54-room mansion, the country home of railroad baron Frederick William Vanderbilt and his wife, Louise, epitomized the extravagance and privilege of the aristocracy in the Gilded Age. Tour the home and stroll the estate's grounds, including the Italian-inspired gardens.

Turn of the Century

Bannerman Castle (Beacon)

Explore the ruins of this Scottish-style castle built in the early 1900s by military surplus dealer Francis Bannerman on Pollepel Island in the Hudson River to store his vast inventory of weapons and munitions and advertise his business. Witness amazing views of the Hudson Highlands as a tour boat shuttles you from Beacon to the island. Enjoy guided tours of the castle, residence and gardens, and special events like movie screenings and theatrical performances. Open seasonally.

Old Rhinebeck Aerodrome (Red Hook)

Home to the world's second-oldest regularly flying airplane — a fully functioning 1909 Bleriot XI — and a flying reproduction of Charles Lindbergh's plane, *The Spirit of St. Louis*. Watch a weekend airshow with barnstormingera or WWI planes. Book a flight in a 1929 biplane with an experienced pilot. Open seasonally.




20th Century

Franklin D. Roosevelt Home, Presidential Library and Museum (Hyde Park)

See where our 32nd president was born, lived and laid to rest. Learn about the adaptations made to accommodate his paralysis from polio. The FDR Presidential Library and Museum chronicles the lives of the Roosevelts, including Franklin's political ascendancy. On display through 2024, the special exhibit "Black Americans, Civil Rights and the Roosevelts, 1932-1962" examines the political evolution of the Roosevelts regarding racial justice and highlights the voices of Black community leaders, wartime service members and ordinary citizens.

Eleanor Roosevelt National Historic Site (Hyde Park) Across town from FDR's historic sites is the only National Historic Site dedicated to a first lady. Val-Kill, the main cottage on the property, features an exhibit documenting Eleanor Roosevelt's emergence as a social and political dynamo and includes her work to help draft the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. House open seasonally; trails open year-round.

OUTDOOR RECREATION

DISC GOLF

Play multiple layouts for up to 24 holes at **Beacon Glades Disc Golf Course**, designed around an abandoned summer camp with beautiful mountain views. **Hackett Hill** (Hyde Park) is a dynamic 9-hole wooded course, while **Tymor Park's** 9-hole layout in Union Vale features wide-open fairways. For a challenge, tackle the PDGA-rated 27-hole course at **Wilcox Memorial Park** (Stanfordville).

PICKLEBALL

Quiet Cove Riverfront Park (Poughkeepsie) debuted four brand-new pickleball courts in 2023, including an ADA-accessible court for wheelchair-using players. James Baird State Park (Pleasant Valley) has several courts amidst robust sports activities and trails, including an educational playground. Find three outdoor courts at Staatsburg's Dinsmore Park.

CAMPING

Malouf's Mountain Campground (Beacon) is perfect for the novice camper with no gear and no car — they supply everything needed for a getaway. The Rudd Pond Area at Taconic State Park boasts 15 tent sites and 26 tent platform sites with views of the Taconic Mountain Range, pond and nearby countryside. Similarly, choose from 27 campsites at Wilcox Memorial Park.

SAILING

Sail aboard the **Hudson River Sloop Clearwater** — a faithful replica of a 19th-century Dutch vessel co-founded by folk music legend and environmental activist Pete Seeger — and learn about the Hudson River and the local environmental movement. **Nothing But Time Sailing Charters** (Poughkeepsie) serves champagne with sunsets on a 40-foot sailing yacht.

PADDLING

Explore Mills-Norrie State Park on the Hudson River with Atlantic Kayak Tours, launching from Vanderbilt Mansion or Staatsburgh State Historic Site. Paddle through Tivoli Bays, along the shoreline of Franklin D. Roosevelt's Springwood estate or to Bannerman Castle with The River Connection. Hudson River Expeditions launches explorations of Fishkill Creek and Denning's Point at Scenic Hudson's Long Dock Park, just a short walk away from Beacon train station.

BIKING

Bike shops and rental facilities include **Bikeway** (Wappingers Falls and Beacon) and **City Bike Rentals PK** (Poughkeepsie), as well as **Pedego** (Beacon) for electric bike rentals.





HUDSON VALLEY HIKES PERFECT FOR ALL ABILITIES

EASY:

Tivoli Bays — Explore two miles into this large intertidal marsh via woodland trails and boardwalks.

Madam Brett Park — Experience the crossroads of stunning natural beauty and history via this short boardwalk trail, which brushes past the historic 1879 Tioranda Hatworks and native wildlife in Beacon.

Dover Stone Church — A calm stroll through the woods reveals a breathtaking cathedral-shaped entrance to a cave, complete with a waterfall and a "natural skylight." During The Pequot War in the 1600s, Chief Sassacus and his warriors hid inside.

MEDIUM:

Ferncliff Forest Fire Tower — This woodsy preserve in Rhinebeck spans 200 acres and draws campers, fishers and hikers with 12 miles of trails. The fire tower rewards intrepid climbers with a dramatic panoramic view.

Cat Rocks — The Pawling destination on the AT provides novice and moderate hikers with a pulse-quickening ascent to a gorgeous overlook.

Poets' Walk Park — Celebrate the connection between landscape and poetry with miles of rustic pavilions, bridges and benches in Red Hook. It was designed around 1850 as a series of "outdoor rooms" between two nearby estates.

CHALLENGING:

Brace Mountain — Millerton's majestic Brace Mountain holds the title of tallest peak in Dutchess County (2,300 feet above sea level), presenting a challenging hike with a rewarding finish.

Stissing Mountain — Hike to the top of Stissing Mountain in Pine Plains and climb the fire tower's stairs for views of five surrounding states.

Mount Beacon — Sitting at over 1,500 feet above sea level, the summit at Mount Beacon provides views of Beacon, the Hudson River and the surrounding Hudson Highlands.

ICONIC ART

Dia Beacon

Located in a former Nabisco box-printing plant, this is one of the largest exhibition spaces in the U.S. for contemporary art. Andy Warhol's *Shadows* is at Dia Beacon for long-term view, alongside works by Richard Serra, Blinky Palermo, Louise Bourgeois and others.

Frances Lehman Loeb Art Center

(Vassar College, Poughkeepsie)

Designed by famed architect Cesar Pelli, the museum is free to visit and houses 22,000 pieces in its collection, ranging from antiquities to the present day. See works by Pablo Picasso, Georgia O'Keeffe, Jackson Pollock and the Hudson River School painters.

KuBe Art Center (Beacon)

Famous curator Ethan Cohen has two galleries — one in New York City and the other in Beacon at the KuBe Art Center. Among the recent exhibitions in Beacon is *Back to School*, a reimagined look at the high school experience that Cohen cocurated with renowned pop artist Ron English.

CCS Bard's Hessel Museum of Art

(Bard College, Annandale-on-Hudson)

The Hessel Collection is comprised of more than 3,000 works of art by more than 500 prominent artists from the 20th and 21st centuries. Free to enter.

Wassaic Project (Maxon Mills, Wassaic)

Maxon Mills, home to the Wassaic Project, is an historic, seven-story wooden grain elevator that has been repurposed into a uniquely magnificent venue for artists of all types to show their work.

Throughout Dutchess County

Poughkeepsie, Hyde Park and Beacon boast eye-catching murals by artists Nèstor, Franc Palaia and Risa Tochigi (aka Riiisa Boogie). Check out **The Art League of Hyde Park and Poughkeepsie's** walking map of outdoor murals to find open-air art.

PERFORMING ARTS FESTIVALS

Kaatsbaan Spring and Fall Festivals

(Kaatsbaan Cultural Park, Tivoli)

Kaatsbaan is a 153-acre artist sanctuary on the Hudson River that serves as an incubator for innovative dance, theater, music, film, poetry, culinary, and visual arts. They host events and performances throughout the year.

Bard SummerScape, SpiegeItent and Music Festival

(Fisher Center at Bard College, Annandale-on-Hudson) SummerScape features live opera, dance, theater, music, film and cabaret from June through August every year. It runs alongside the Bard Music Festival, which features discussions, events and performances focused on one composer. The Spiegeltent, a glittering, mirrored tent-like pavilion, hosts live performances, drinks and dancing all summer.

Powerhouse Theater (Vassar College, Poughkeepsie) Known as the theater that premiered *Hamilton* before it became a Broadway smash, Powerhouse has cemented its reputation as the place to see a new work while it's in development. Each year, it features a superb lineup of imaginative and insightful plays and workshops.

New York Stage and Film (Marist College, Poughkeepsie) This has been a showcase for emerging and established artists since 1985, including the 2023 world premiere of the theatrical work *Like They Do in the Movies*, written and performed by Laurence Fishburne.

Beacon Bonfire Music + Art Festival

This annual festival showcases hundreds of musicians, artists and performers at dozens of venues and galleries throughout Beacon. Snuggle up by one of the cozy campfires all along Main Street, and take advantage of discounts on food, drinks and retail items.

MODfest (Vassar College, Poughkeepsie)

Enjoy a week-long exploration of the arts of the 20th and 21st centuries that includes live performances of music, dance and theater, visual arts exhibits and more.

Jazz in the Valley (Victor C. Waryas Park, Poughkeepsie)
This annual festival welcomes world-class musicians to the
beautiful Poughkeepsie waterfront for a celebration of jazz.
Sit under the tent, or bring your own chair or blanket and
relax on the lawn.

HOT SPOTS

Daryl's House (Pawling)

Owned by Rock and Roll Hall of Famer Daryl Hall of Hall & Oates fame, this restaurant and live music club hosts regular events. Recent acts include John Cafferty and the Beaver Brown Band, Ambrosia and a variety of tribute bands.

Towne Crier Cafe (Beacon)

From blues, folk and jazz to rock and bluegrass musicians, there's no telling who'll take the stage at the legendary Towne Crier, which has been around for more than 50 years and has hosted the likes of John Sebastian, David Byrne and Rick Derringer.

Quinn's (Beacon)

Housed in a former luncheonette in Beacon, Quinn's gives you the full indie experience, hosting worldrenowned avant-garde jazz musicians and regional rock acts — complete with a bowl of ramen on the side.

MJN Convention Center

(Poughkeepsie)

This venue has welcomed some of the biggest names in entertainment to the Hudson Valley for more than 40 years — from legendary rockers Bruce Springsteen, Dropkick Murphys and Kiss to A-list comedians, including Nate Bargatze, John Mulaney, Kevin Hart and Jo Koy.

Happy Valley Arcade Bar (Beacon)

This cheery arcade bar features modern and retro machines (including Dance Dance Revolution) and regularly hosts drag shows and other engaging performances.





PERFORMANCE VENUES

Fisher Center at Bard (Annandale-on-Hudson)

Designed by Frank Gehry and located on the campus of Bard College, this magnificent venue hosts orchestral and jazz concerts, dance productions and other events.

Bardavon 1869 Opera House (Poughkeepsie)

Set in the heart of Poughkeepsie, this historic theater has hosted legendary performers from Weird Al Yankovic to Norah Jones. Accessibility features include seating, portable audio-loop receivers and sensory-sensitive performances.

CENTER for Performing Arts (Rhinebeck)

See a variety of productions at this community theater — recent shows include Hamlet, Cabaret and Peter and the Starcatcher — as well as popular family programming featuring child performers.

Stissing Center for Arts & Culture (Pine Plains)

This oasis offers world-class, affordable and diverse performances from the finest international, national, rural and local talent.

Howland Cultural Center (Beacon)

This architecturally gorgeous building has stood at the heart of Beacon's walkable downtown for more than 150 years and continues to be a community arts and performance space, hosting concerts by the Howland Chamber Music Circle, Beacon Litfest and a variety of workshops and art exhibits.

BACK TO SCHOOL

Must-See Attractions at County Colleges

DUTCHESS COUNTY is home to several renowned institutions that offer top-tier educations, but that's the tip of the iceberg. Hidden on these scenic campuses are breathtaking works of art, panoramic views of the Hudson and must-see events.

VASSAR (Poughkeepsie)

One of the Seven Sisters, Vassar College is known for its renowned arts programs; in fact, their free-to-visit on-campus art gallery, The Frances Lehman Loeb Art Center, gives visitors an up-close look at works by masters like Georgia O'Keeffe, Francis Bacon and Pablo Picasso—plus a collection of Hudson River School paintings only found here. In summer, stargaze at the Maria Mitchell Observatory, a National Historic Landmark.

Did you know? Lin-Manuel Miranda and other members of the original cast of *Hamilton* debuted the musical during Vassar College & New York Stage and Film's Powerhouse Theater in 2013.

Bard (Annandale-on-Hudson)

Bard College stands on 1,000 scenic acres, which includes the Bard Arboretum, 19th-century walled Blithewood Garden and walking trails that reveal gorgeous views of the Catskill Mountains and Montgomery Place — the region's only surviving Federal-era estate house. Architect Frank Gehry designed the striking Fisher Center at the heart of campus. Visit in the warmer months to experience the Bard Music Festival and SummerScape, an eight-week-long festival of contemporary dance, theatrical performances and concerts at the Fisher Center and inside the boisterous Spiegeltent.

Did you know? Rock band Steely Dan's song "My Old School" is about founders Walter Becker and Donald Fagen's experience attending Bard College in the late 1960s.

MARIST

(Poughkeepsie)

For one of the prettiest walks along the Hudson River, visit Longview Park at the edge of Marist College's beautiful campus. Shop at Mporium, a boutique run entirely by Marist fashion merchandising students, for curated collections of items featuring top trends in the marketplace.

Did you know? The Poughkeepsie Regatta was held off the shore of Marist College from 1895 to 1949 and was a pivotal win for the men's eight team that won gold for the United States in the 1936 Summer Olympic Games in Berlin (recently depicted in George Clooney's 2023 film The Boys in the Boat).



Dine where most of the country's top chefs learned the art of cooking! Hyde Park has The Culinary Institute of America, a world-famous center for study in the techniques and fundamentals of the culinary, baking and pastry arts. Taste inventive dishes at one of the on-campus restaurants — American Bounty Restaurant, The Bocuse Restaurant, Ristorante Caterina de' Medici and Apple Pie Bakery Café — which serve as real-world classrooms. Take The CIA Experience tour for a student-led interactive demo exploring the science of taste. Enroll in one of the CIA's food enthusiast classes or boot camps and receive hands-on cooking instruction from culinary experts.

Did you know? Anthony Bourdain, Amanda Freitag, Cat Cora and Grant Achatz are just a few alumni who have made a massive mark on the modern culinary scene.

GROUP TOURS

Dutchess County creates one-of-a-kind memories for group tours with farm-fresh meals, vintage gardens, beautiful scenery and an abundance of historic sites. Below is a sampling of the wealth of unique group experiences in Dutchess.

Walkway Over the Hudson offers ambassador-guided tours of the world's longest elevated pedestrian bridge. The museum and airshows at Old Rhinebeck Aerodrome take groups back to the Golden Age of aviation.

The iconic history of President Franklin D. Roosevelt and Eleanor Roosevelt is a main attraction for groups visiting Hyde Park. The Home of Franklin D. Roosevelt National Historic Site is the birthplace and final resting place of America's 32nd president. Eleanor Roosevelt's cottage, Val-Kill, is the only National Historic Site dedicated to a first lady. The immersive exhibits at the FDR **Presidential Library and Museum** provide visitors with a deeper insight into the Roosevelts and their countless contributions to the world. A special exhibit — "Black Americans, Civil Rights, and The Roosevelts, 1932-1962" — will be on display through 2024.

Make a point to visit **Clermont State Historic Site**, where the re-envisioned tour of the 18th century mansion includes the lives of the enslaved

people who lived there. Their research has identified 26 people by name and the new visitor center highlights rare artifacts that tell their stories.

Get to know the real high society figures featured in the HBO television series "The Gilded Age" with a tour at **Staatsburgh State Historic Site**. Costumed docents guide groups through the elaborate country estate of Ruth Livingston Mills, an arbiter of New York society. Minutes away, tour **Vanderbilt Mansion National Historic Site**, the 54-room country home of Frederick and Louise Vanderbilt who exemplified the "new money" of the era's industrial growth.


MEETINGS & CONFERENCES

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

DUTCHESS COUNTY

Origin: English

Dutchess County is named after Mary of Modena, then Duchess of York and wife of the future King James II of England. The county's name is derived from the archaic, 17th-century spelling of "duchess." In 1683, Royal Governor Thomas Dongan established the original 12 counties of New York, naming them after the aristocratic titles of the royal family.

POUGHKEEPSIE Origin: Wappinger

The Wappinger tribe named this area Uppuqui, meaning "reed-covered lodge," along with ipis (meaning "little water") and ing (meaning "place"). This all culminated in Uppuqui-ipis-ing, which translates to "the reed-covered lodge by the little water place." Variations of the name included "Pokeepsing," "Poughkeepsing" and finally, "Poughkeepsie."

HUDSON RIVEROrigin: English, Lenape

Henry Hudson, an Englishman working for the Dutch East India Company, sailed up the river that now bears his name in 1609, laying claim to the region for the Dutch Republic. By the time European immigrants settled along the Hudson, the river had been home for centuries to the indigenous Wappinger people and other members of the Algonquin Federation. The southern half of the Hudson River's 315-mile course from the Adirondack Mountains to New York Harbor is an estuary (a brackish body of water that forms where the freshwater of a river and the saltwater of the ocean come together). The ebb and flow of the tide makes the arm of the sea run both north and south, which led the native Lenape people to call it the Muhheakantuck, or "the river that flows both ways."

FISHKILL

Origin: Dutch

The name Fishkill is derived from two Dutch words: Vis (meaning "fish") and Kill (meaning "creek, stream or water channel"). Fishkill was settled by the Dutch in 1714.

LAGRANGE Origin: French

The town of LaGrange is named after the estate in northern France owned by Gilbert du Motier — better known as the Marquis de Lafayette. A major general under George Washington in the Continental Army, the Marquis de Lafayette lived at "Chateau de la Grange-Bléneau" ("La Grange," as it was later known) from 1799 until his death in 1834. Lafayette visited Dutchess County in September 1824 as part of his farewell tour, offering inspiration for the town's name.



Beekman Arms (Rhinebeck)

America's oldest continuously operated inn has stood at the heart of Rhinebeck's walkable downtown since 1766 and is convenient to a robust assortment of dining and shopping options. During the Revolutionary Continental Army performed drills on the lawn. Distinguished guests included George Washington, Benedict Arnold, Aaron Burr and Alexander Hamilton. More recently, Roosevelt, Bill Clinton, Oprah Winfrey, Neil Armstrong, Frank name a few.

Troutbeck (Amenia)

Tucked away in the bucolic Amenia countryside, this 250-acre estate has been a country inn and tavern since the 1700s and was the site of Attendees at these meetings (the

co-founder of the NAACP, as well as groundbreaking writer, sociologist and activist W.E.B. Du distinguished guests was civil rights African American Supreme Court Justice. Other guests of the property Langston Hughes, Ernest Hemingway, Henry David Thoreau and Ralph Waldo Emerson.

Hotel Caravana (Amenia)

If you're looking for a truly unique, wonderfully nostalgic place to spend the night, look no further than Hotel Caravana at Four Brothers Drivevintage airstream campers provide the perfect retro getaway. Catch a double feature on the big screen, play a round of mini-golf and relax by the fire pit. Enjoy a delicious meal from Four Brothers Restaurant next door and tasty treats from the Grand Shack concession stand. It's Americana at its finest.

Wing's Castle (Millbrook)

Constructed almost entirely of recycled Ann Wing offers a one-of-a-kind and memorable experience. Soak up the Room, the Cottage or the Annex Suite. Tour the grounds, visit nearby Millbrook the cute village of Millbrook for a trip

Brinckerhoff Inn (Fishkill)

This fully restored mansion, which remained in the Brinckerhoff family for nearly 300 years, has provided travelers with luxurious accommodations for centuries. Famous guests have included George Washington, Benjamin Franklin and Thomas Jefferson. For several weeks in the fall of 1778, the Marquis de Lafayette recuperated from an illness in the second-floor bedroom of the Brinckerhoff home and was nursed back to health. That room is available and named after the Marquis.
